
SYMPATHY WISHES



RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Chesapeake Style Oyster Dressing

1/4 pound butter or margarine

4 T. finely chopped onion

4 T. finely chopped celery

4 cups dry bread crumbs

¼ tsp. pepper

Salt to taste

2 cups oyster in bite size pieces

2 T. fresh parsley

1 can water chestnuts chopped, (optional)

1 cup slivered almonds

(optional)

Melt butter in skillet. Stir in onion, celery, and oysters reserving ¼ cup of oyster liquid. Mix oyster liquid with dry bread crumbs and set aside. Cook primary mixture over low heat until onion is soft.

Add mixture to crumbs and liquid. Toss lightly with salt, pepper, and parsley. For a crunchy dressing, add mixture to a casserole and top with the chestnuts and/or almonds until toasted on top for about 10 minutes @ 350 degrees, uncovered. Broil for the last minte.
